<u>Directions</u>: Read through the definition for each part of the plot. Then, after reading your novel, fill in the blank boxes on the attached plot diagram.


Exposition: At the beginning of the story, characters, setting, and the main conflict are typically introduced.

Rising Action: The main character is in crisis and events leading up to facing the conflict begin to unfold. The story becomes complicated.

Climax: At the peak of the story, a major event occurs in which the main character faces a major enemy, fear, challenge, or another source of conflict. The most action, drama, change, and excitement occurs here.

Falling Action: The story begins to slow down and work towards its end, tying up loose ends.

Resolution: Also known as the denouement, the resolution is like a concluding paragraph that resolves any remaining issues and ends the story.
