### Created with a Purpose: Kennedy Catholic's Mental Health Program

Kennedy Catholic Family of Schools is enhancing its commitment to student mental health through the Created with a Purpose program. In partnership with the April Bocian Foundation and Angelus Therapeutic Services, the school is establishing a dedicated mental health room on the 7-12 campus. This safe space offers students access to licensed professionals for support and guidance as they navigate personal and academic challenges.

To further support these efforts, the April Bocian Foundation hosted a Butterfly Release fundraiser. The event symbolized hope and transformation, with all proceeds going toward mental health initiatives, including the maintenance of the new room.

With this program, Kennedy Catholic ensures that students have the resources they need to thrive, prioritizing mental well-being alongside academic success.



### Kennedy Catholic Schools Awarded \$100,000 Safety Grant

Kennedy Catholic Family of Schools was recently awarded a \$100,000 grant from the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinguency (PCCD) to enhance campus safety and security. The funds have been used to hire a security guard implement key upgrades, including the installation of Bolo Sticks for each classroom, buzzer security systems, internal/ external cameras, and the Navigate 360 Alert System for emergency communication. Additionally, the school has reinforced its crisis management plan and installed deadbolt locks to further secure the campus.

These improvements are part of Kennedy Catholic's ongoing commitment to ensuring the well-being of its students and staff. We are thrilled to welcome our Head Football Coach Julian Cox as our security guard. The school is also actively pursuing additional funding to continue enhancing safety measures, reflecting its dedication to creating a safe and secure learning environment for all.

### Eagle Etiquette

Saint John Paul II Elementary has developed a creative and engaging PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) program with the Eagle Etiquette initiative. The focus on students being ready to learn, responsible, respectful, and safe aligns with the PBIS core principles, which promote a positive school climate and reinforce positive behavior through recognition.

Students demonstrating Eagle Etiquette earn golden tickets which include a scratch off section to reveal their reward. Rewards include golden eggs with mystery prizes inside, Lunch with the Principal and a classmate, free books, no homework passes, and an assortment of KC items.

SJPII Elementary is motivating students to follow desired expectations in the hallways, cafeteria, restrooms, specials, and classrooms. This approach has helped to foster a sense of community, belonging, and mutual respect within the school environment. Plans are underway to add a few more components to the program which will be rolled out to students during Catholic Schools Week.







### Peace, Love and Service

This school year, Saint John Paul II Elementary is focusing on our school motto of, Christo Servire through our theme of Peace, Love and Service. Students across all grade levels will learn what it means to serve Christ through various service projects. Students will help to plan service projects that help to serve the need of our communities and school. Each grade level will learn about a Saint that is unique to their classroom. ## **Business Pathway**

In Kennedy Catholic's Business Pathway, students are gaining firsthand entrepreneurial experience through a unique collaboration with Gannon University's Small Business Development Center. This innovative program allows students to run their own enterprise through the KC Spirit Store. In the store, they take on roles similar to those in a real business. Tasks range from managing operations to marketing products. One of the program's standout projects is the creation of the KC Coffee Blend, a collaboration with Giavonna's Gourmet Coffee. Students are deeply involved in all aspects of marketing the product. This gives them real-world insight on how to create, launch, and sustain a product in the marketplace.

Beyond product development, students learn essential business skills like inventory management, stocking, and pricing, which are crucial for running a successful business. Through their work in the KC Spirit Store, they gain practical experience in supply chain management and customer service skills.

Additionally, students can earn dual enrollment business credits from Gannon University as they progress through the Business Pathway. This helps them to gain valuable college credits without ever leaving the building. With access to local entrepreneurs and industry mentors, students are not only learning how to start their own businesses, but are also developing confidence. This knowledge will bring their ideas to life in the real world. The hands-on approach prepares them to thrive in the competitive business landscape.

## Culinary Pathway

Kennedy Catholic High School's Culinary Pathway provides students with hands-on training under the guidance of professional chef Rob Simmers, who brings over 25 years of culinary experience. Currently, students are focusing on baking, supported by a \$10,000 grant that has funded a mobile unit to become the KC Mobile Café. This café will allow students and staff to purchase fresh pastries and goods in the morning, along with specialty coffee drinks and lattes featuring the KC Coffee Blend. The students are not only gaining culinary skills but are also learning business management as they work in these student-run enterprises.

Looking ahead, the culinary students plan to give back to the community by cooking a meal for the homeless at the Prince of Peace Center in the spring. They will also host an exciting KC Iron Chef Challenge, with KC Alumni Chef Celebrity judges, bringing even more real-world experience to their training. This challenge will be turned into a production by the school's broadcasting students, allowing the entire student body to watch the event in the gymnasium during an assembly. These activities provide students with a comprehensive education, blending both culinary expertise and business acumen.









## Manufacturing Pathway

The Manufacturing Pathway at Kennedy Catholic High School is off to a strong start, offering students invaluable experiences through job shadows, tours, and internships, as well as a bridge into trades. To launch this program, we hosted a Pathway Partnership Breakfast in collaboration with the Lawrence Mercer Manufacturers Coalition and the Homegrown Initiative by PNDC, connecting students with prominent local manufacturers such as Ellwood, NLMK, and G.W. Becker Crane. In addition, our middle school students will participate in the "What's So Cool About Manufacturing?" initiative, where they will create an engaging video with help from our broadcasting students.

Students interested in this pathway are already learning to operate advanced equipment, including the CNC machine in the Valley Fab Lab, and are gaining hands-on experience with cutting-edge technology. We also have exciting plans to reboot our robotics program, with the goal of competing in robotics competitions next year and expanding our STEAM offerings. This program is led by our dedicated teachers, Adam DeParasis (math/business) and Kayleigh (Trobeck) Hoagland ('18) (science/robotics), who are working to ensure our students are prepared for the modern technological and industrial landscape.

## Room Upgrades for Pathways

At Kennedy Catholic High School, we are committed to providing our students with an optimal learning environment, especially in our Pathway programs. To enhance the educational experience, we recently upgraded the floors and furniture in the Pathway classrooms, using \$50,000 in grant funds for both room and security improvements. These updates have modernized the spaces, creating a more engaging and dynamic environment where students can thrive as they explore their chosen career pathways. This investment ensures that our students have access to a cutting-edge learning atmosphere that supports both collaboration and focused study.





## Broadcasting our Pathways

## Kennedy Catholic Welcomes the Valley Fab Lab

At Kennedy Catholic High School in Hermitage, exciting new opportunities are on the horizon for both students and community members with the addition of the Valley Fab Lab. As part of a collaborative effort with Gannon University's Small Business Development Center and Whole Life Services, the Fab Lab will utilize several classrooms to provide hands-on learning experiences in both business and advanced manufacturing techniques. The goal is to empower students with the skills they need for the future, opening new career pathways in fields such as business, manufacturing, and entrepreneurship.

The Fab Lab features nearly a dozen high-tech devices, including laser printers, vinyl etching machines, sewing machines, fabric printers, and 3-D printers. These tools provide students and community members the opportunity to create custom items and learn the technology behind each machine. Zach Marriotti, the Fab Lab's assistant manager, is trained on all of the machines and helps teach others how to use them. Marriotti, who came to the Fab Lab through Whole Life Services, has become an expert in operating these devices, and he offers training for a \$35 fee to those interested in learning how to operate them. His expertise was on full display

during the Fab Lab's grand opening at Kennedy Catholic, where he demonstrated the capabilities of the lab's equipment alongside manager Jonathan Richardson.

"The machines can create almost anything that anyone could come up with," Marriotti said. "Pretty much seeing what we can come up with next is what excites me the most about the Fab Lab."

Marriotti's contributions are an example of the inclusive and empowering opportunities offered by the Fab Lab. Whole Life Services, which provides support for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, is a key partner in the project. The Fab Lab offers more than just technical training—it gives individuals like Marriotti the chance to showcase their talents, creativity, and leadership.

"This is a great opportunity for our students to get hands-on experience and learn how to use technology for real-world applications," said Karen Ionta, Interim President of Kennedy Catholic Schools. "It's going to give our students a whole new opportunity."

Students will have the chance to learn high-demand skills like sign-making, silkscreening, embroidery, woodworking,

and even 3D printing. These creative and technical skills will be paired with business classes that allow students to earn college credit and gain practical experience by selling the products they create in the school's new store. The lab aims to help students realize that technology is more than just for entertainment—it's a tool for creativity and innovation, equipping them for successful careers in the modern world.

"This is really what the Fab Lab is all about—helping students and community members use technology to be creative and productive," said Maggie Horne, director of Gannon University's Small Business Development Center.

The Fab Lab also extends beyond the school's walls, offering services to the entire community. Local businesses can utilize its machines for tasks such as placing logos on materials and creating custom designs. The Fab Lab's new location within Kennedy Catholic provides greater visibility and accessibility for its services, making it a valuable resource for both the school and the surrounding area.

Opportunity has been one of the Fab Lab's main objectives since it was established in 2021. The collaboration between Kennedy Catholic and Whole Life Services is already proving to be a mutually beneficial partnership. The Fab Lab will not only enhance the school's science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) curriculum but will also bring new life to the school's industrial arts facilities, which include a woodshop equipped with saws and hand tools to complement the high-tech equipment in the Fab Lab.

Kennedy Catholic students will also have the chance to engage in other forward-thinking programs, such as the school's cybersecurity certificate program, which could offer graduates the potential to earn high-paying salaries directly out of college. These programs reflect the school's commitment to preparing students for success in a rapidly evolving job market.

As Kennedy Catholic continues to expand its offerings, the Valley Fab Lab is a major step forward in providing students and the community with diverse, handson learning experiences. By integrating technology, creativity, and business education, the Fab Lab ensures that students are well-prepared for the future, whether they choose to pursue higher education or enter directly into the workforce. The lab's official opening marks the beginning of a new chapter of opportunity and innovation at Kennedy Catholic High School.

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






## 2023-2024 Kennedy Catholic Girl's Basketball Back-to-**Back State Champions**
